

Meeting Month	June 2023
BURIAL GROUNDS	An interment of cremated remains took place in May, and two further interments are booked in June. Quotation received for a galvanised metal replacement for the existing handrail.
ROADS AND VERGES	Nothing new to report.
TREES AND GREENS	The bi-annual tree audit is scheduled for 25 June, including agreed treatments to the horse chestnut next to the Windmill.
PARISH WORKS	The next working party will be on Sunday 11 June, jobs to be advised.
FOOTPATHS	Nothing new to report.
PLAYING FIELD AND ALLOTMENTS	The remains of the bonfire and the spoil heap have been removed and a feature gate fitted at the start of the avenue of rowans to the Picnic Area (named Cheese and Pickle Way by the Chairman!). Next, the area set aside for wildflowers will be lightly ploughed ready for planting.
VILLAGE HALL AND PLAY AREA	At the Village Hall Management Committee's Annual Meeting on 22 May a proposal was presented regarding the creation of a Charitable Incorporated Organisation to own and manage the Village Hall. This would offer several advantages whilst retaining the current protections provided by being registered with the Charity Commission.
DEFIBRILLATORS	Both defibrillators are in service order. Dates/times for training for public in use of a defibrillator are still being considered.
POLICE LIAISON	Cllr. Thompson (Police Liaison Representative) will attend the meeting of parish and town councils with the PFCC on 6 June. Consideration is being given to a project for support from the Community Payback Team.
PLANNING	There have been no new planning applications as of the date of this report. A response is still awaited from WNC regarding excavation work on land bordering Catesby Lane.
WEBSITE/FACEBOOK	Nothing new to report.
NEWSLETTER	Preparation is underway on the Parish Council summer newsletter to be distributed at the end of June - updates/articles from local clubs and societies are still welcome.
OTHER	The Parish Council would like to thank everyone who supported the Coronation Picnic on 7 May, in particular the WI for providing teas and the Field Jammers for the musical entertainment. We were especially lucky with the weather. Cllr.
